Changes to break eating times

This term we have changed our timetable slightly by altering our break eating times. Wednesday Day 0 Initiatives

We have introduced an Inquiry One Day Programme where our top Social Science students will be working with our Learning Area Leader of Social Science (Miss Oliver) during blocks 2 to 5 to do an inquiry investigation related to the Otahuhu Canal Reserve Portage. The programme will include these students working alongside Auckland Council and Otahuhu Community personnel, as well as providing a young persons perspective on the proposed Auckland Council restoration of the Otahuhu Canal Reserve Portage.

Also this term there will be a Sports Camp Group run by Miss Silipa and Miss Talagi. There will be 40 students selected to participate in the Counties-Manukau Sports Camp event being held at Camp Adair, Hunua from Monday 30 August to Friday 3 September 2021. We have selected an initial group of approximately 50 students who will be involved every Wednesday in blocks 2 to 5. These students will be involved in fitness and coaching sessions related to the wide range of sports that they will be competing in. We want to ensure all our students have the best possible chance to compete to the best of their ability at the Sports Camp and represent OIS proudly.
