## What you need to do

## COVID-19 Symptoms that your child might have

- A new or worsening cough
- Sneezing and runny nose
- A fever
- Temporary loss of smell or altered sense of taste
- Sore throat
- Shortness of breath
- Less common symptoms include diarrhoea, headache, muscle aches, nausea, vomiting, malaise, chest pain, abdominal pain, joint pain, or confusion/irritability.

## What we're doing

- Otahuhu Intermediate School will stay open.
- We have appropriate public health measures and cleaning procedures in place.
- All students are expected to wear masks at all times.
