We have reached the middle week of term 1. We can all agree that it has not been the best start to a school year for our teachers, our tamariki, our parents, caregivers and whanau. We have all been challenged as we work our way through COVID-19 Omicron and the impact that it is having on our lives. It is true, challenges certainly make you stronger. We believe that as an OIS community we have navigated our way through the COVID pandemic extremely well. Congratulations to all of you!

We'd like to take this opportunity to thank all our parents, caregivers and whanau who have kept us informed regarding positive cases in their households. This has enabled us to monitor the number of students cases in our school and the numbers of families being affected by isolating at home for 10 days. We are well aware that the 10 day isolation brings additional pressures to everyone involved. We are here to help if you require some additional support.

If your child is going to be away from school, we encourage you to use the absence form on the school website or school app or phone the school before 8.45am. Remember to leave full name, room number and reason for absence.

OIS Expectations during COVID-19 Omicron:

- If your child is unwell, please keep them home and get them tested.
- ♦ If your child has been isolating at home, we would like proof of a negative result -CPR test (within 12 hours) or RAT test (the morning of) before they return to school. We suggest you place a piece of paper on a table, write your child's full name, room number and date of the RAT test and take a picture of it. This can then be emailed to your child's teacher.
- If your child is away for medical reason (not COVID related), then we are encouraging you to get a medical certificate as proof for the school.

We are doing everything we can to keep Otahuhu Intermediate School safe for all. We appreciate that the above 'OIS Expectations' are additional, but these are necessary to keep everyone safe during this RED PHASE.

Once again, we thank you all for everything you are doing to keep everyone in our OIS community safe.

<u>SCHOOL APP</u> - if you were unaware, Otahuhu Intermediate School does have a school app that you can download on to your mobile phones.

Update from the Auckland Transport Metro Bus Team.

Tāmaki Makaurau is at the red setting of the COVID-19 Protection Framework.

As Omicron spreads, many bus operators are experiencing staff shortages and service cancellations across bus, train, and ferry services. Although Auckland Transport is working hard to update cancellations in our systems, there may be some occasions when these are last-minute and can't be communicated in time. We recommend checking service updates on the AT Mobile app, Live Departures, or on digital signs at stops and stations.

If you're using AT school Bus.

We are trying our best to make school bus services our priority and run most school bus services to a regular timetable. However, we are expecting to see last-minute cancellations due to the spread of Omicron in the community. Although we're working hard to update cancellations in our systems, there may be some occasions when these are last-minute and can't be communicated in time.


Meet Our Board Members
